
## Homework 4: Classifying invertebrates


Arthropods are split into four groups: crustaceans, insects, arachnids, and centipedes and millipedes. Crustaceans have chalky shells and 10–14 legs (although one pair of legs might be pincers).

Insects have six legs and bodies divided into three sections. Arachnids have eight legs and bodies in two sections. Centipedes and millipedes are long, thin and have many legs and many sections.


1 Look at the pictures below. On the line underneath each one, write the word crustacean, insect, arachnid or centipede/millipede.
