




These are some examples of artwork on skateboards.

Alton Towers: The Wicker Man



Passengers are taken around a maze of twisted track before hurtling towards a six-storey high flaming figure... The Wicker Man.

The £16m Wicker Man ride is a major addition for Alton Towers. It was in development for four years, involving 500,000 man hours, 7,500 tonnes of wood, 1.8m screws and 65,000 bolts. As with any rollercoaster, it's a significant feat of engineering – and, in this case, lots of special effects.

The team at Alton Towers has been keen to make a wooden rollercoaster for years. The Wicker Man is the first wooden rollercoaster to be built in the UK in more than 20 years. Many people were shocked that the ride's designers chose to mix wood with fire.

At the start of the ride I am strapped in and then a booming voice tells us we are about to be sacrificed to the Wicker Man. Moments later, I'm flying down the track, the train clattering along, twisting, turning and plunging, then diving through the middle of the flaming Wicker Man effigy, which has a face on one side and a ram's head on the other. While the rush doesn't compare with that of a high-G-force, cheek-quivering thrill ride, there's a thrill that comes from hurtling around a track that looks like a delicately arranged pile of matchsticks. An amazing experience worth the two hour wait!

What is your opinion of graffiti?

Jackie Chan's very worst injury ever, the one that almost killed him, actually occurred on a very routine stunt. He was shooting "Armour of God" in Yugoslavia, and was still recovering from the jet lag of flying twenty hours to get there. He was 32 and the stunt was simple-just jumping down from a castle wall to a tree below. The first time he tried it, the stunt went perfectly, but he wasn't satisfied with the take. He tried it again, and the second time, he somehow missed the branch he was trying to grab. He fell past the tree and onto the ground below. Actually, there was a cameraman down there trying to capture a low angle, and if he hadn't scrambled out of the way, Jackie would have probably landed on him. They would both have been hurt, but not badly. Instead, he hit the rocky ground, head first. A piece of his skull cracked and shot up into his brain, and blood poured from his ears. The production team quickly got on the phones to try to find the nearest hospital that could do emergency brain surgery, and eight hours later, he was going under the knife. The operation was successful, and Jackie recovered quickly - even though there's a permanent hole in his head now, with a plastic plug there to keep his brains in. The "Armour of God" fall also left him hard-of-hearing in one ear.
